## **Course Description**

This course incorporates reading and evaluation of literary and informational selections to develop critical and close reading skills. At the end of 6th grade, students are expected to proficiently read and comprehend complex texts that cover grades 6-8 and read texts at the high end of the scale with support. Students enrolled in the course should be consistently challenged with increasingly complex text.

#### Makeup Work Policy

Students who are submitting late work (due to absence) should have one day, or one day for each day absent (whichever is greater), to submit work unless the teacher determines there are extenuating circumstances which necessitate an extension, or a school-wide policy exists that grants additional time. Students will receive an "X" (Excused) in the gradebook only when they were absent when the assignment was completed or due. An "X" is not worth any points and will not influence the student's average grade. Students will receive an "M" (Missing) in the gradebook only when they have been given an opportunity to complete an assignment but has yet to turn it in. An "M" is considered a zero and will influence the student's average grade. **<u>Attendance</u>** – The following procedure is a school-wide policy:

Students will receive a warning for every 1<sup>st</sup> tardy. Parents will receive a phone call for every 2<sup>nd</sup> tardy. Students will receive another warning and parents will receive another phone call for every 3<sup>rd</sup> tardy. Students are given a referral for every 4<sup>th</sup> tardy.
